

Dear Exam Taker & Family,

Thank you for your interest in taking the SAT exam at our school! Here is some basic information which you will need to make your SAT test day experience less stressful:

- 1) You should plan to arrive approximately **45-60 minutes** before the scheduled start of the exam to give yourself plenty of time for the sign in process. Upon arrival, you will be asked a series of questions regarding COVID-19 and will have your temperature taken before entering the check-in and exam areas.
- 2) During the check-in process, you must present your exam admission ticket and a valid, government or school-issued photo ID. **Photocopies and photos of IDs are not acceptable forms of identification.** Failure to provide proper identification will result in you not being permitted to sit the exam. If you leave the testing room for any reason, be sure to take these documents with you as you will be required to show them in order to return to the exam room. - 3) You may not bring any electronic devices into the exam, except for your SAT-approved calculator. You will be asked to turn over your mobile phone, smart watches or any other electronic devices. They will be placed in a clear plastic bag with your name on them. These devices will be returned to you after the exam has ended. - 4) If you are taking an SAT exam which has math sections, don't forget to bring a calculator as you may use it in one of the math sections. You will be asked to put your calculator on the floor under your desk until it is needed. Please make sure your calculator is one which has been approved for use during the SAT exam. - 5) Be sure to bring two **n° 2 pencils with erasers** for the exam. You cannot use mechanical pencils or ink pens on the exam.
- 6) It is a good idea to bring a small bag or backpack to carry your belongings. You may bring drinks and/or snacks for the break periods of the exam, but you must not eat or drink near the test materials.
